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About the West Health-Gallup Survey

The new public opinion survey on nursing homes in the U.S. was carried out between July 5 - 24, 2023 by Gallup in partnership with West Health. Gallup surveyed 2,145 adults living in all 50 U.S. states and the District of Columbia, All samples are weighted to correct for unequal selection probability and non-response. Post-stratification weighting takes into account gender, age, race, Hispanic ethnicity, education and region. Demographic weighting targets are based on the most recent Current Population Survey figures. The survey carries a margin of error at the 95% confidence level of +2.7 percentage points for response percentages around 50% and +1.6 percentage points for response percentages around 10% or 90%, design effect included. For the reported gender sub-groups, the margin of error will be larger, ranging from ±2.2 to ±3.7 percentage points.
